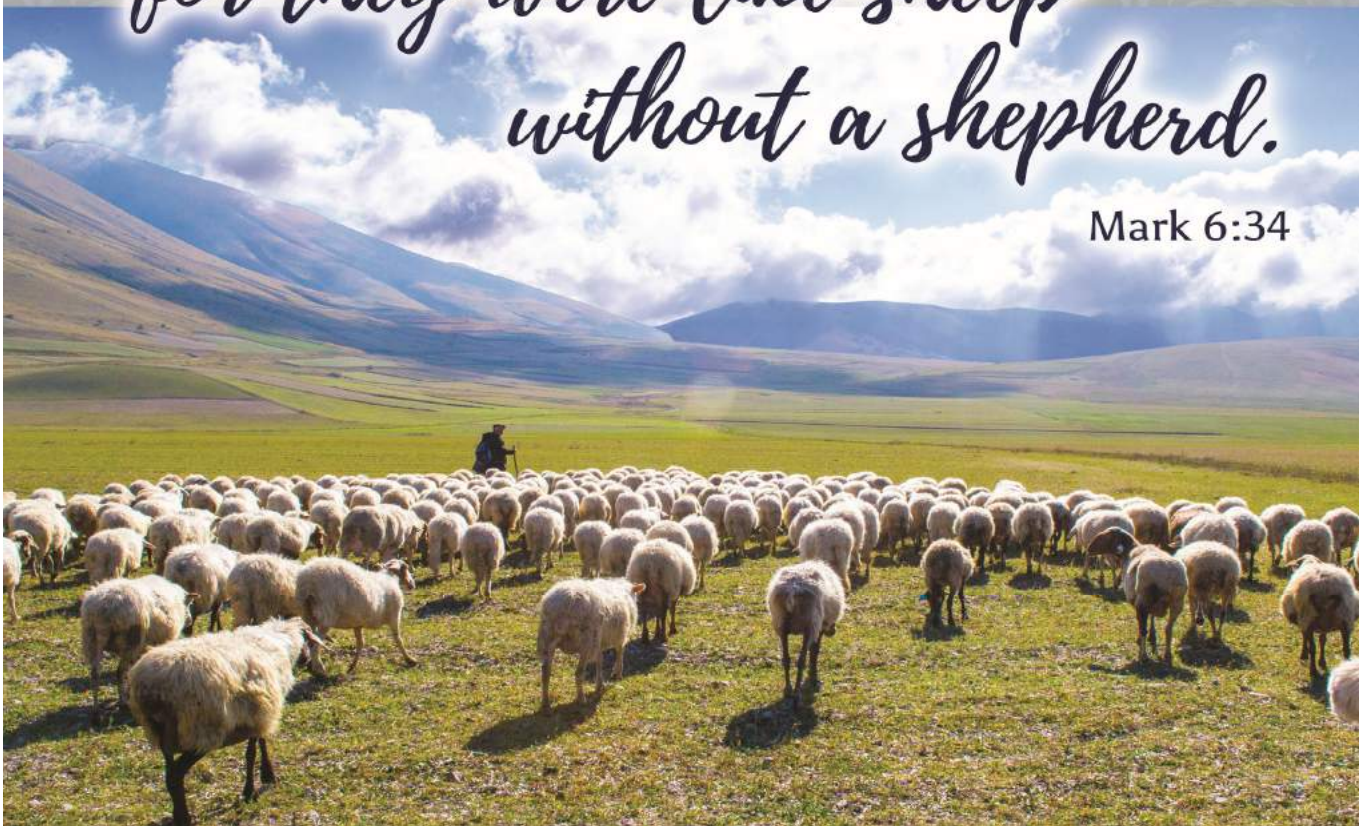

In addition to donations from parishes, individuals, and local businesses, SVDFB gets food from Feeding South Florida. Much of it is free and the rest is at a very small cost. For the 2018 fiscal year, St. Vincent DePaul Society received 221,251 pounds of food with a retail value of \$382,764.22; their cost was only \$1,310.46!
