“Know Your Faith”

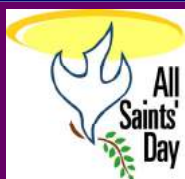
Knowing the essentials of our Catholic faith is essential. We attain this knowledge by reading, studying, discussing, listening and praying. We have a sacred tradition going back to the time of Christ that reflects our beliefs, practices and acceptances. Through the centuries the truth has always emerged untarnished.

Invariably, at some point of time, writers, speakers and producers have taken liberty with the facts and our beliefs. Such variations including fantasy, misrepresentation or exaggeration may have confused many. Fiction, fancy and frivolity have been interspersed with truth giving an appealing image to a “factual” story. It is difficult to discern what is historically true and what is pure fiction. Unfortunately the written word or video depiction may not assign disclaimers as to what portions are true and what are false.

It behooves us, every one of us, to be as knowledgeable as possible about the rudiments of our faith. We ought to be protective of our sacred traditions which have survived the centuries even though frequently misrepresented. Any insinuation that is new, sensational or unsubstantiated should be dismissed. The real truth will reemerge and survive for future generations. This faith-tradition is the avenue to lead us to eternal salvation. We cannot permit others to degrade it as it is sacred to us. Diminish our faith and our background and you diminish each of us.

Imagine a scenario in which extreme liberty, fabrication, falsehood and fantasy are applied to every religious tradition, every culture, and every family that exists today. Rightfully, groups would be offended and would take corrective action to remedy the injustice. For some reason it appears permissible by many in society to attack, distort and falsify what Catholics believe and hold sacred. Maybe it’s because they know our faith is the true faith given to us by Christ himself. Keep the faith!
