***“The Mystery of Faith”***

A couple celebrating fifty years of marriage remark, "We're still learning about each other." A longtime friend claims, "I've never seen that side of her before." At funerals, hearing stories about the deceased loved one, people remark, "I never knew that about him." Does this sound vaguely familiar? It is strange that even with a lifetime of familiarity we can still be surprised by those we know best. There is no way we can know all about another person. We can know historical facts, but not the personal data that makes them unique.

The celebration of the feast of the Holy Trinity finds us professing this unexplainable truth of God: three persons, one God. This is the mysterious truth of the Trinity; God is relational. God lives and moves in a loving relationship with us. We come to know, love and serve God through His self-revelation.

God is revealed as Creator and loving Father. Life begins and exists solely out of His love for us.

God is revealed as Teacher and Redeemer. It is in Jesus that God's love touches our minds and our hearts, teaches and informs us about life, our Lord, and each other.

God is revealed as Guide and Sustainer. In the Spirit, we are continually drawn to God. It is His perpetual abiding presence and love that is a part of our every breath, thought, and movement.

This mystery of our faith, the Holy Trinity, might be best understood as a slow, steady revelation of God to us. Thus, we come to see a God who reaches out to us in countless ways. More than a simple gesture of love, God's love is a revelation into His very existence. More than a mystery, it is our daily experience of God through the Holy Trinity that sustains us.
