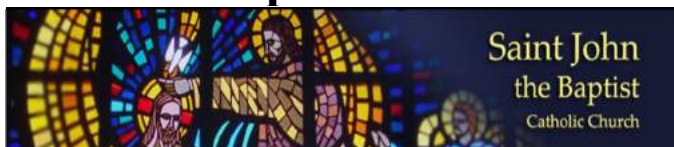

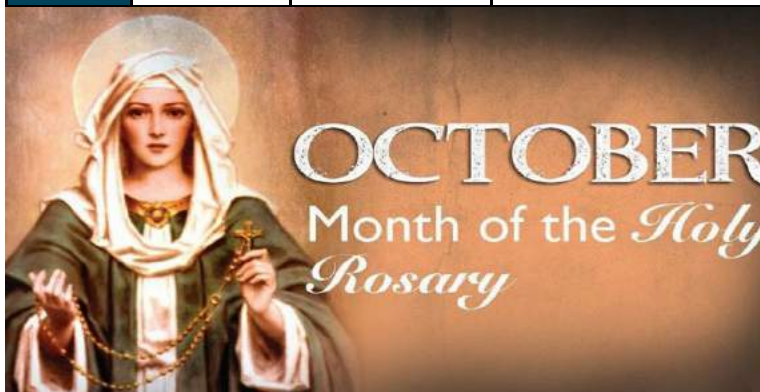

Respect Life Baby Supply Drive: Urgent Need

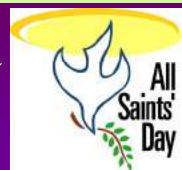
